A) Información de la SRE sobre las becas a China:

a) La Convocatoria de becas para realizar estudios de **maestría y doctorado**, ofrecidas por el Gobierno de la República Popular de China por conducto del Ministerio de Educación, abre en el mes de enero de cada año, en las áreas de ciencias (incluye acupuntura), tecnología, arte y humanidades. La edad máxima es de 35 años. La duración es de un año. La fecha aproximada para el inicio de los estudios es a partir de septiembre de cada año. La beca incluye un año de estudio del idioma chino, según sea el grado académico y la disciplina seleccionada.

Beneficios

- * Pago de Inscripción y colegiatura.
- * Asignación mensual para manutención de 2000 yuanes.
- * Seguro médico.
- * Gastos de instalación, por única vez, 600 yuanes para estudios de un año académico más.
- * Transportación interna en China, de existir viajes conforme al programa de estudios establecidos.
- * Apoyo para material didáctico.
- * Hospedaje (habitación gratuita).

Requisitos Específicos

* Formulario de solicitud de beca del Gobierno de China (Application Form for Chinese Government Scholarship), debidamente llenado en idioma chino, inglés y/o español (original y copia).

* Título profesional, (dos copias), certificado de materias cursadas y calificaciones obtenidas en los estudios universitarios, o en su caso de posgrado, (dos copias), y acta de nacimiento, deberán ser certificados ante Notario Público y acompañados de traducciones al idioma inglés o chino.

* Los postulantes deberán anotar claramente los nombres de tres universidades chinas donde deseen realizar sus estudios. La información de las universidades chinas se proporciona junto con la solicitud de beca.

* Plan de estudios en China. Deberá presentarse en inglés y con un mínimo de 500 palabras, original y copia.

* Los interesados en postular para áreas artísticas, deberán presentar fotografías de obra, recortes de prensa o cintas grabadas de recitales o conciertos.

* Certificado médico expedido por una institución médica pública nacional en el formato del Gobierno de la República Popular de China (dos originales y copia).

* Cartas de recomendación expedidas por dos profesores.

Nota importante: Los candidatos deberán tener observancia en cuanto los estudios que realicen en China, que exista la revalidación oficial ante la Secretaria de Educación Pública (SEP) y si son estudios de medicina ante la Secretaría de Salud. b) Becas para **profesores de idioma chino**, con duración de un mes y 15 días. La convocatoria se abre en el mes de enero. En idioma chino y/o inglés. La edad máxima es de 55 años. La fecha aproximada para el inicio de los estudios es en septiembre.

Requisitos específicos

* Certificado del último grado académico cursado, título profesional o de grado con sello notarial, con traducción al inglés.

* Solicitud del Gobierno chino debidamente llenado en idioma chino y/o inglés.

* Ser profesor del idioma o cultura china.

* Certificado médico expedido por una institución médica pública en el formato del Gobierno de la República Popular de China.

Nota importante: El pasaje aéreo, viaje redondo, deberá ser cubierto por el becario.

B) Procedimiento de Aplicación para las becas del Gobierno Chino (Application procedures for Chinese government scholarship)

Chinese Government Scholarship scheme was established by the Ministry of Education of China (hereinafter referred to as MOEC) in accordance with educational exchange agreements or understandings reached between the Chinese government and the governments of other countries, educational organ, institutions and relevant international organizations to provide full scholarship and partial scholarship to international students and scholars. China Scholarship Council (hereinafter referred to as CSC) administers the recruitment of international students and the routine management of the Chinese Government Scholarship scheme.

Remedial Chinese language studies are arranged before major studies. If the courses for doctoral and master degree students could be conducted in English, remedial Chinese study will not be arranged. Duration for scholarship specified at the time of admission could NOT be extended in principle.

Application

The applicants may apply to Chinese diplomatic missions or the competent authorities in their home country between January and April every year. Applicants may refer to the relevant authorities for details.

Eligibility

1. Applicants must be non-Chinese nationals in good health.
2. Education background and age limit:
 - Applicants for undergraduate studies must have completed senior high school with good grade and be under the age of 25.
 - Applicants for master degree studies must have bachelor's degree and be under the age of 35.
 - Applicants for Doctoral degree studies must have master's degree and be under the age of 40.
 - Chinese language students must have finished senior high school and be under the age of 35, will pursue the major of Chinese language in China.
 - General scholar candidates must have completed at least two years of undergraduate studies and be under the age of 45, may pursue all majors besides Chinese language.
 - Senior scholar candidates must have master or higher degree or hold academic titles of associate professor or higher, and be under the age of 50.

Details of the Scholarship

1. Full scholarship:
 - Exempt from registration fee, tuition fee, fee for laboratory experiment, fee for internship, fee for basic learning materials and accommodation;
 - Living allowance and a one-off settlement subsidy;
 - Fee for outpatient medical service, Comprehensive Medical Insurance and Benefit Plan for International Students in China;

-A hard-seat train ticket between the port of entry on registration or the port of departure on graduation and the city where the host university or the university of Chinese language studies is located (a hard-berth train ticket for over-night trip).

Note: 1) Costs of the laboratory experiment or internship that beyond the university's arrangements should be afforded by the student himself.

2) Scholarship students who have to suspend their education for reason of illness should:

- Return to their home country for further treatment and rest;
- The international travel expenses of return and coming back should be shouldered by the students themselves;
- The scholarship status will be reserved for at most one year;
- The monthly living allowance will be stopped during the suspension of education;
- The scholarship of the students who suspend their education for reasons other than illness will be terminated.

3) Monthly living allowance is paid to the students by the host institution at the following rates (CNY yuan per month):

- Undergraduates: CNY 800 yuan
- Chinese language students: CNY 800 yuan
- Master degree students, general scholars: CNY 1,100 yuan
- Doctoral degree students, senior scholars: CNY 1,400 yuan

Scholarship students shall get their monthly living allowance from the date of registration. Those who register before 15th (15th included) of the registration month will get the living allowance of a full month, and those who register after 15th will get that of a half month. Scholarship of the graduates will be paid half month after their graduation date. Scholarship of those who suspend or quit their studies will be stopped from the following month. Monthly living allowance will be paid during Chinese national holidays. Scholarship students who do not get the monthly living allowance during holidays can get reimbursed on return. Monthly living allowance of the scholarship students who do not register on time or stay away from university up to one month because of non-health reasons will be stopped.

4) Fee for outpatient medical service refers to the outpatient expense generated in the institution's hospital or the hospitals appointed by the institution. The students should afford a certain percentage of expense in accordance with the institution's relevant regulations.

5) Comprehensive Medical Insurance and Benefit Plan for International Students in China is insured by the MOEC for the scholarship students in China against diseases and accidents. The institution is entitled to ask for compensation on the payment receipts from the insurance company for the expenses generated from hospitalizing for serious diseases or from accidental injury according to the stipulated insurance articles.

6) A one-off settlement subsidy after registration

- CNY 300 yuan for new students whose period of studies in China lasts up to six months

-CNY 600 yuan for new students whose period of studies in China lasts one academic year or more

7) A one-off inter-city travel ticket (each for coming-in and leaving China)

Scholarship students are supposed to choose the nearest port to their admitting institutions for inter-city travel and a hard-seat train ticket (hard-berth train ticket for overnight trip) will be provided to:

-Freshmen transfer from the port of entry to the city where the admitting institution is located

-Students finishing study in China transfer from the city where the institution is located to the nearest port for departure

Expenses for food during the trip and excess of baggage should be self-afforded.

8) International travel expenses

MOEC will provide the international students round-trip or one-way international air ticket based on the reached agreements, and entrust CSC to take charge of booking the most doable and economical international air ticket for the students between Beijing and their capitals. If the students take other line come to China or return back to their home country, they should afford the extra expenses as well as the excess of baggage.

2. Partial scholarship

One or some items of the full scholarship (one-off settlement subsidy and one-off inter-city travel allowance not included).

Application Materials

The applicants must fill in and provide the following materials truly and correctly (in duplicate):

1. Application Form for Chinese Government Scholarship(printed by CSC), one original and one photocopy, in Chinese or in English.

2. Highest diploma (notarized photocopy). If applicants are university students or already employed, they should also provide documents of being university students or on-post employees. Documents in languages other than Chinese or English must be attached with translations in Chinese or English.

3. Applicants for undergraduate studies are required to provide notarized copy of senior high school transcripts. Applicants for other categories of studies also need to provide relevant notarized transcripts. Transcripts in languages other than Chinese or English must be attached with translations in Chinese or English.

4. A study or research plan in Chinese or in English (no less than 200 words for undergraduates, no less than 400 words for scholars, no less than 500 words for postgraduates).

5. Applicants overseas for master or doctoral degree studies and senior scholars must submit two letters of recommendation in Chinese or English by professors or associate professors. Applicants who apply in China for master or doctoral degree studies must submit the Admission Notice of the targeted university.

6. Applicants for music are requested to submit one cassette recording of the applicants' own work. Applicants for fine arts must submit six color photographs of personal works (two sketches, two color paintings and two other works).

7. Applicants under the age of 18 should submit the legal documents of their legal guardians in China.

8. Photocopy of Foreigner Physical Examination Form (printed by Chinese quarantine authority and only for those whose period of studies in China lasts up to six months) filled in English. The medical examinations must cover all the items listed in the Foreigner Physical Examination Form. Incomplete records or those without the signature of the attending physician, official stamp of the hospital or a sealed photograph of the applicants are invalid. The medical examination results will be valid for 6 months. All applicants are kindly requested to take this factor into consideration while determining the time to take the medical examination.

The above materials should reach CSC by April 30th 2007 via either the Chinese diplomatic missions in the applicant's home country or the embassy of the applicant's home country in China. CSC does not accept individual applications. Application materials will not be returned regardless of the result of application.

Selection of Institutions and Specialty

Applicants may choose 3 institutions and 1 specialty as personal preferences from the Chinese institutions of higher education designated by the MOEC. Please check the Directory of the Chinese Institutions Admitting International Students under Chinese Government Scholarship Programme or the website of CSC (<http://www.csc.edu.cn>) for details. Applicants are required to fill in their preferences of institutions and specialties strictly within the ones listed in the Directory. Applicants for master or doctoral degree studies and senior scholars are required to submit their detailed study or research plan with other application materials.

Approval and Notification

1. CSC will review all the application materials from the appointed authorities and CSC is authorized to make necessary adjustments on the applied institutions, specialties and duration of study. The qualified applications will be forwarded to different institutions and the final decision whether to admit the applicants or not will be made by them. The application will be seen as invalid and will not be processed if the applicants are not qualified or the application materials are inconsistent with the recruitment regulations or are incomplete.

2. Overseas applicants for degree programs who are academically ineligible to the program could register as students-on-probation for at most one year. They could be switched to regular ones if they pass the entrance examination or relevant courses required after one-year probation. Credits scored on probation will be included in the total credits. Students who attend Chinese language training courses before major studies must pass the entrance examination or relevant courses required during their Chinese

study so that to continue their major studies. Those who fail the required examinations shall end their study and leave for their home country.

3. Applicants are encouraged to contact the institutions (115 institutions specified by MOEC listed in the Directory) and tutors prior to application and please enclose the relevant admission or recommendation letter if there is.

4. Scholarship applicants accepted by Chinese institutions of higher education will be officially approved as Chinese Government Scholarship students with endorsement from the MOEC.

5. Students are not permitted, in principle, to change their specialties, institutions, or the duration of study specified in the Admission Notice after registration.

6. CSC will send the List of Enrolled Students, Admission Notice and Visa Application Form for Study In China (JW201) to the relevant dispatching authorities by July 31, so as to have these documents forwarded to the awardees.

China/UNESCO "C the Great Wall Fellowship scheme is a full scholarship scheme set up by the Ministry of Education of China (hereinafter referred to as MOEC) for candidates recommended by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). China Scholarship Council (hereinafter referred to as CSC) administers the recruitment and the routine management of the scheme.

Categories of Applicants and Duration of Scholarship

This scheme sponsors general scholars and senior scholars, and in principle the courses will be taught in English with duration of at most one year. Candidates who will be taught in Chinese are required to get the confirmation from both CSC and UNESCO before starting their study. And the total scholarship duration will be one-year Chinese language training plus one-year major study.

Application

Applicants should apply to the National Commission for UNESCO in their home country between January and April every year.

2. Educational background and age limit:

A) Información del Consejo de Becas de China

Chinese Culture Research Fellowship was set up by the Ministry of Education of China (hereinafter referred to as MOEC) to sponsor international experts in field of Chinese culture to carry out short-term research in China. China Scholarship Council (hereinafter referred to as CSC) is authorized to administer the recruitment and the daily management of the scheme.

25 full scholarships will be provided in 2007.

Research Area and Ways

1. Applicants shall be engaged in the fields including Chinese language, literature, history, philosophy, education, economics, ancient architecture, history of art and traditional Chinese medicine and acupuncture.
2. The applicants should be supervised by a Chinese supervisor or cooperate with Chinese professors in the appointed Chinese institutions of higher education to carry out their researches.

Application

1. The applicants could directly apply to CSC for the Chinese Culture Research Fellowship or via the Chinese institutions of higher education, Chinese scholars or Chinese diplomatic missions in the applicant's home country.
2. The duration of the fellowship shall not exceed 5 months. The fellowship could be extended once and the duration of extension shall not exceed 1 month.

Eligibility

1. Applicants must be non-Chinese nationals, in good health and under the age of 55.
2. Applicants must have obtained doctoral degree or hold academic title of associate professor or higher.
3. Applicants must hold fixed profession engaging or mainly engaging in Chinese culture research, with works or papers published in the above fields.

Details of Fellowship

1. Exemption of research fee, and free accommodation
2. Fee for outpatient medical service includes the outpatient expense generated in the institution's hospital or the hospitals appointed by the institutions. The students should afford a certain percentage of expense in accordance with the institution's regulations.
3. Comprehensive Medical Insurance and Benefit Plan for International Students in China is insured by MOEC for the scholarship students in China against diseases and accidents. The institution is entitled to ask for compensation on the payment receipts from the insurance company for the expenses generated from hospitalizing for serious diseases or from accidental injury according to the stipulated insurance articles.
4. Monthly research subsidy, the standard is CNY 3,000 yuan
5. A one-off subsidy for data collection, the standard is CNY 750 yuan
6. Expenses of academic tour that is based on the research plan could be reimbursed to the scholar with the approval of the supervisor or the cooperating professor. The standard is no more than CNY 1,000 yuan.

Application Materials

The applicants must fill in and provide the following materials truly and correctly.

1. Application Form for Chinese Culture Research Fellowship (printed by CSC). One original, one photocopy, in Chinese or in English.
2. List of publications; documents in languages other than Chinese or English must be attached with translations in Chinese or in English.
3. Research plan written in Chinese or in English (no less than 2000 words).
4. Letter of recommendation by the person in charge of the applicant's working institution; documents in languages other than Chinese or English must be attached with translations (notarized photocopy) in Chinese or in English.

Applicants shall submit the above application materials to CSC 3 months prior to the date they apply to come to China.

Approval and Notification

B) Información de la NSFC:

Targets set for International Cooperation and Exchange Projects

Ever since its establishment, the National Natural Science Foundation of China (NSFC) has continuously stressed on the importance of international (regional) cooperation and exchange. As an integral part of NSFC's work, international cooperation and exchange aims at promoting basic research and the progress of science funding system in China. To this end, NSFC strives to create a favorable environment regarding cooperative channels, funding and operational mechanism so as to facilitate the participation of Chinese scientists in the international cooperation and exchange. Up to now, it has signed cooperative agreements and memoranda of understanding with 60 science funding organizations and national research institutions in 35 countries and regions and raised its budget for international cooperation and exchange from 3 million yuan in 1987 to 82 million yuan at present. It has gradually formed a rather complete funding scenario which includes four project categories and three special funds: joint research projects, international (regional) academic conferences held abroad, international academic conferences held in China, major joint research projects, fund for Chinese scholars abroad returning for short-period of work or lecture (including "two bases" projects), joint fund

between NSFC and the Research Grant Council of Hong Kong and fund for international cooperation and exchange of State key laboratories.

Project Categories and Special Funds

1. Joint Research Projects

It funds joint research activities conducted by Chinese scientists (who undertake on-going NSFC research projects) with their foreign counterparts in the areas of mutual interests. The fund covers the costs for the exchange of personnel and information, and cooperation in scientific experiments. It is the priority funding category by NSFC in its international cooperation and exchanges.

2. International Academic Conferences Held Abroad

It is of great importance to support Chinese scientists to participate in international academic conferences held abroad because it provides a good opportunity for them to keep abreast of the latest achievements and development of major research areas and new growing points in their scientific disciplines and to establish contacts and relations with foreign scholars for future cooperative research.

Funding for this category mainly covers international travel expenses.

3. International Academic Conferences Held in China

International academic conferences held in China facilitate Chinese scientists' wide participation in international cooperation and exchange and upgrade the research quality of NSFC funded research projects. Therefore, NSFC provides funding for international and regional important academic conferences which are closely related to the priority funding areas of NSFC or to newly emerging scientific disciplines.

Applicants must be entities supported by NSFC and have the capability and resources to organize international conferences.

Funding for this category mainly involves seed money at the initial period of preparation of the conference.

4. Major International (Regional) Joint Research Projects

It aims at strengthening the competitiveness of China in basic research and promoting Chinese basic research in some areas to the international forefront. It adheres to the principle of "equality, cooperation and mutual benefit" and strives for enhancing our innovative ability for basic research. The duration of funding is generally three to four years.

Funding for this category covers research costs and expenses for exchanges.

5. Fund for Chinese Scholars Abroad Returning for Short-period of Work or Lecture (including "Two Bases" projects)

(1) Fund for Chinese Scholars Abroad Returning for Short-period of Work or Lecture

NSFC establishes this special fund in an attempt to create favorable conditions for encouraging overseas Chinese scholars to actively participate in the research of NSFC funded projects so that they can give full play to their intelligence and talent and make contributions to the Chinese S&T endeavor.

Funding for this category involves living expenses for overseas Chinese scholars during their short-term stay in China to conduct joint research, organize workshops or seminars, and attend international conferences or other related activities.

(2) "Two Bases" Projects

NSFC encourages prominent overseas Chinese scholars to conduct in-depth and sustainable joint research or academic exchanges with their collaborators in the mainland. Overseas Chinese who get approved after evaluation will be provided funding to work at least one month a year in China for three consecutive years, so as to gradually form, in addition to their laboratories abroad, their research bases in China. This is the so-called "Two Bases" model.

Overseas Chinese scholars and their host institutions in China should work together to identify research subjects as well as the specific work each side will undertake, and to lay out feasible joint working plans.

Funding for this category involves research funds and exchange costs. The funding intensity is usually equivalent to that of the current-year General Program project and the fund will be distributed in three years.

6. Joint Fund between NSFC and Hong Kong Research Grant Council

NSFC and Hong Kong Research Grant Council jointly establish this fund to support the cooperation between scientists in the inland and Hong Kong. Funding from each side is generally used to cover local expenses of the joint research projects. The duration of each project is three years and priority is given to those relatively large and sustainable projects. Funding in the category mainly includes research expenditure, travel and accommodation fees and other costs identified by both parties.

7. Fund for International Cooperation and Exchange of State Key Laboratories

The Fund is to support international cooperation and exchange activities conducted by the State key laboratories. It encourages these laboratories to participate in international cooperation and competition so as to bring into full play their strength in upgrading our basic research as well as in training highly qualified talents.

Priority of funding is given to joint research conducted by permanent staff from the State key laboratories which have passed regular examination and departmental open laboratories which have been rated "good" and above in the national unified evaluation. They are also encouraged to organize various types of international academic conferences in China. Appropriate preferential support will be provided to those labs which have been rated "excellent" during the examination to encourage their international cooperation and exchanges.

1. Applicants must be principle investigators of on-going NSFC research projects;
2. Applicants for the Fund for International Cooperation and Exchange of State Key Laboratories must be permanent staff of the State key laboratories which have passed the examination or departmental open laboratories which have been rated "good" and above in the national unified evaluation.

MOU Projects and Non-MOU Projects

International cooperation and exchange projects can be divided into "MOU projects" and "non-MOU projects".

1. MOU Projects

A) Información de la Página del MOE de Taiwán:

I. Purpose

Since 2004, four government agencies of the Republic of China (Taiwan) --- Ministry of Education (MOE), Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA), Ministry of Economic Affairs (MOEA), and National Science Council of the Executive Yuan (NSC) ---have jointly established the Scholarship Program of Taiwan to encourage outstanding international students to undertake degree programs in Taiwan . While providing study opportunities for a wide range of disciplines, at Taiwan 's universities and colleges, this program also aims to:

- a. Promote knowledge, understanding and friendship between Taiwan and countries around the world.
- b. Explore opportunities to increase academic and educational links with international institutions of higher learning.
- c. Develop outstanding professionals and experts to meet the needs from Taiwan 's business and industry sectors.

II. Types of Scholarships

In terms of recipients' nationalities and study programs, there are four participating agencies funding this program, each with a different focus:

a. MOFA Scholarship :

* Recipients from countries with diplomatic relations with the R.O.C. (Taiwan), or from those specified as diplomatically favorable by MOFA.

* Undergraduate or postgraduate programs. Pre-degree Mandarin Language Enrichment Program (LEP) is to be included as recipients' choice for improving their language abilities.

b. MOE Scholarship :

* Recipients from countries other than those specified in the MOFA Scholarship.

* Undergraduate or postgraduate programs. LEP is to be included as recipients' choice for improving their language abilities.

c. NSC Scholarship :

* Recipients from countries other than those specified in the MOFA Scholarship.

* Postgraduate programs.

d. MOEA Scholarship :

* Recipients from countries other than those specified in the MOFA Scholarship.

* Postgraduate programs, only for the areas involving scientific technology (such as physics, chemistry, mathematics, engineering, medicine and agriculture to name a few)

III. Value

Scholarship offerings vary from agency to agency as outlined below:

a. MOFA Scholarship:

* International airfare for economy-class, direct-route and roundtrip flights, plus a monthly stipend of NT\$30,000 (approximately US\$950).

b. MOE Scholarship:

* A monthly stipend of NT\$25,000 (approximately US\$790) for undergraduate or LEP study, and NT\$30,000 for a postgraduate program.

c. NSC Scholarship:

* A monthly stipend of NT\$30, 000.

d. MOEA Scholarship:

* A monthly stipend of NT\$30, 000.

IV. Duration

The award period for each study program varies as follows:

a. Undergraduate program: maximum 4 years.

b. Master's program: maximum 2 years.

c. Doctoral program: maximum 3 years.

d. LEP program: maximum 1 year.

For any combination of these study programs, the length of the total award for each recipient is a maximum of five years . LEP study must be undertaken in the first year, if it is to be included in the total award period of the recipient's choosing.

Annual award periods are from September 1 st through August 31 st . If recipients fail to arrive in Taiwan to study during this period, their award status will be cancelled and cannot be extended for another year. If recipients begin studies after the semester/term/quarter starts, their award period will become effective from the month they arrive in Taiwan to matriculate at their individual universities/colleges/Mandarin training centers. Whether beginning in September or later, the LEP award period ends in August although its length may be less than the specified maximum of one year.

In terms of the actual award period for one study program, it will begin from the month that recipients arrive in Taiwan to matriculate at their intended educational institutions. All awards will end the month their specified award period is completed. However, if recipients graduate, drop out, are expelled from their institutions, or their scholarships are revoked, whichever comes first, the award will be terminated.

V. Eligibility

An applicant must meet all of the following criteria:

- a. Possess prior excellent academic performance and be of good moral character.
- b. Does not hold the Republic of China (Taiwan) nationality.
- c. Does not have the status of an overseas Chinese student.
- d. Is not currently enrolled at an educational institution in Taiwan , for the same study program that he/she intends to take for a SPOT scholarship.
- e. Is not an exchange student in accordance with a cooperation agreement between an international university/college and an educational institute in Taiwan , at the time of receiving a SPOT scholarship.
- f. Is not applying for a study program leading to the same-level degree as previously undertaken under the SPOT Program.
- g. Has not received SPOT scholarships for a total of 5 or more years.
- h. Has not previously had an award revoked either under the SPOT program or the program "Ministry of Education Huayu Enrichment Scholarship."
- i. Is not a current recipient of a scholarship or subsidy being offered by any one of government or educational institutions in Taiwan.

Those who are undertaking degree programs at international universities/colleges may be eligible to apply for SPOT awards, if those degree programs are comparative with the same level of degree programs in Taiwan.

VI. Application and Selection Process

For application receipt, review and selection, applicants must send their completed documents to the Taiwan representative office, closest to their home countries' permanent residence. In principle, the application period is from February 1 st through March 31 st of each year, unless individual Taiwan 's representative offices specify otherwise. For application guidelines and forms, scholarship types and quotas, as well as information about the selection process and outcome announcement, applicants may directly contact the relevant representative offices at the end of January.

A complete application includes the following materials:

- a. A completed application form.
- b. Photocopy of passport or other nationality certificates.
- c. Photocopy of the highest-level diploma and a complete grade transcript.

< N.B. These documents must be authenticated by a Taiwan 's overseas representative office, if issued by international educational institutions. >

d. Supporting admission application material (e.g. photocopy of application form).

< N.B. LEP applicants must submit documents for admission, not only to a Mandarin training centre, but also to the next-stage university/college. The exact academic years that applicants would be enrolled full-time at these two institutions must be clearly specified on these documents. The study period for these two programs must not be discontinued. >

e. Photocopy of a certificate of the acceptable levels of English or Chinese language proficiency, depending on whichever language will be used for instruction in class.

< N.B . Only applicants for degree programs must submit this document. >

f. Additional documents, if any, to be specified by individual representative offices. In principle, selection priority will be given to those who intend to undertake a degree program and have successfully secured admission to a university/college.

VII. Re-Applying

Upon completion of a degree program, recipients may re-apply for a SPOT Scholarship to undertake another degree program, by following the rules of the application process as specified above. Each recipient's total award period cannot exceed 5 years.

Only a LEP scholarship may be granted the next-stage award period for a degree program, through the universities/colleges they will be attending, upon completion of their LEP study. For this processing, the required documents are a photocopy of admission to a university/college and that of an acceptable English or Chinese language certificate attesting to proficiency for their degree studies. >

VIII. Renewal

To review recipients' award qualifications for the next academic year, individual universities/colleges will conduct an evaluation process for the SPOT scholarship renewal by February 28 th of each year.

Each educational institution may set grading criteria for the minimum academic average for a semester, or may take the common criteria--- 60 out of 100 for undergraduates and 70 for postgraduates. For recipients in grade 3 of their doctoral programs, this evaluation should be done by the way as specified by individual institutions, since systems vary from discipline to discipline, in terms of requirements for session credits and scheduling of dissertation writing.

Recipients will be permanently disqualified from receiving any SPOT awards, effective September of the new academic year, if they fail to achieve a specified minimum academic average for two single consecutive semesters of study.

VIII. Suspension and Revocation

(I) Suspension

A. Degree Programs:

If a recipient fails to achieve a specified minimum academic average for a semester, stipends for one month will be suspended in the following semester.

B. LEP Program:

a. Attendance Records:

With the exception of a serious illness or accident, if a recipient is absent from his/her required Language sessions for 12 or more hours within a single month, stipends for the following month will be suspended.

b. Academic Performance:

Beginning from the second study term/quarter in Taiwan , if a recipient's academic average for a study term/quarter is less than 80 out of 100, stipends for one month will be suspended in the following term/quarter.

c. TOP Mandarin Proficiency Rating (<http://cpt.mtc.ntnu.edu.tw/Eng/index.asp>) :

(a) A one-month-stipend suspension will be imposed if a recipient fails to submit to his/her individual Mandarin training center, a photocopy of a TOP (Test of Proficiency---Huayu) certificate with results rated at the basic level or above, by July 31 st , one month before his/her LEP award period is due. Registration fees for this TOP test are the full responsibility of the recipient.

(b) However, if the recipient succeeds in this TOP test during his/her next-stage award period for a degree program, the suspended one-month stipends as stated above will be reimbursed, by his/her application with the university/college that he/she will be attending.

(II) Revocation:

A recipient may be permanently disqualified from receiving a SPOT scholarship and the remaining stipends will be cancelled, if one of the following situations arises:

A. Degree Programs:

a. Failure to submit at the time of matriculation for each semester, an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) with the reason "Study," on the deadlines as specified by his/her university/college.

b. Failure at the evaluation for annual renewal of his/her SPOT scholarship.

c. Failure to submit a photocopy of an acceptable English /Chinese language proficiency certificate, if he/she transfers to a new program of study, for which the other language is to be used for instruction.

d. Dropping out or being expelled from school.

e. In receipt of another scholarship or subsidy, offered by one of Taiwan 's government or educational institutions.

B. LEP Program:

a. Failure to submit at the time of matriculation for each study term/quarter, an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) with the reason "Study," on the deadlines as specified by his/her Mandarin training center.

b. Failure to achieve an academic average of 80 or above out of 100 for two single consecutive terms/quarters of study, beginning from the second term/quarter after studying in Taiwan .

c. Absence from exams as a result of missing a score for a study term/quarter, with the exception of a serious illness or accident.

d. Dropping out or being expelled from school.

e. In receipt of another scholarship or subsidy, offered by one of Taiwan 's government or educational institutions.

X. Transfer

After studying for a semester/term/quarter at a university/college/Mandarin training center, a recipient may be allowed to transfer once during the course of a degree/LEP program, only if the pertinent educational institutions approve this request.

A recipient, who undertakes degree study, must submit the new institution a photocopy of an acceptable English/Chinese language proficiency certificate, if he/she transfers to a new program of study, for which the other language is to be used for instruction.

XI. Scholarship Granting

In principle, stipends are granted before the 5 th day of each month, through the universities/colleges/Mandarin training centers which the recipients attend, and by a method as specified by the individual institutions.

It is mandatory that recipients participate in the National Health Insurance Plan and purchase the policies of the Student Accident Insurance during the period of their residence and study in Taiwan. The recipients' educational institutions will deduct fees for these insurance plans from the recipients' stipends, before the processing of the fund granting to them.

I. Purpose

To encourage international students and individuals to undertake Mandarin study in Taiwan, the Ministry of Education of the Republic of China (Taiwan) established in 2005, the program "Ministry of Education Huayu Enrichment Scholarship." While providing study opportunities for Mandarin language and Taiwan's culture at university- or college-affiliated Mandarin training centers, this program also aims to:

- a. Contribute to a better command of the Mandarin language, and hence a greater understanding and appreciation of Taiwan's culture.
- b. Promote friendship between Taiwan and countries around the world.
- c. Explore opportunities to increase exchange with international education institutions.

II. Value

A stipend of NT\$25,000 (approximately US\$790) is to be offered to a recipient by month.

III. Duration

The following are four options for a recipient to choose from, regarding the award periods:

- * One year
- * Nine months
- * Six months
- * Three months

A recipient is also to be allowed to select an award period of two months, if his/her intended Mandarin training center offers a session for a term of two months.

Annual award periods are from September 1st through August 31st. If recipients fail to arrive in Taiwan to study during this period, their award status will be cancelled and cannot be extended for another year. If recipients begin their studies after the study term/quarter starts, their award period will become effective from the month they arrive in Taiwan to matriculate at their individual Mandarin training centers. Whether beginning in September or later, the award period ends in August.

In terms of the actual award period for this Mandarin study program, it will begin from the month that recipients arrive in Taiwan to matriculate at their intended Mandarin training centers. All awards will end the month their specified award period is completed. However, if recipients drop out, are expelled from their institutions, or their scholarships are revoked, whichever comes first, the award will be terminated.

IV. Eligibility

An applicant must meet all of the following criteria:

- a. Possess prior excellent academic performance and be of good moral character.
- b. Does not hold the Republic of China (Taiwan) nationality.
- c. Does not have the status of an overseas Chinese student.

d. Is not a current student either at a Mandarin training center, or at a university/college in Taiwan.

e. Is not an exchange student in accordance with a cooperation agreement between an international university/college and an educational institute in Taiwan, at the time of receiving a HES scholarship.

f. Has not previously received an award either under this scholarship program or the Scholarship Program of Taiwan.

g. Is not a current recipient of a scholarship or subsidy being offered by any one of government or educational institutions in Taiwan.

Those who are financially self-supporting while undertaking their degree or Mandarin studies in Taiwan may be eligible to apply for HES awards, upon completion of their current programs of study.

V. Application and Selection Process

For application receipt, review and selection, applicants must send their completed documents to the Taiwan representative office, closest to their home countries' permanent residence. In principle, the application period is from February 1st through March 31st of each year, unless individual Taiwan 's representative offices specify otherwise. For application guidelines and forms, scholarship quotas, as well as information about the selection process and outcome announcement, applicants may directly contact the relevant representative offices at the end of January.

A complete application includes the following materials:

a. A completed application form.

b. Photocopy of passport or other nationality certificates.

c. Photocopy of the highest-level diploma and a complete grade transcript.

< N.B. These documents must be authenticated by a Taiwan's overseas representative office, if issued by international educational institutions. >

d. Supporting admission application material (e.g. photocopy of application form).

e. Additional documents, if any, to be specified by individual representative offices.

VI. Suspension and Revocation

(I) Suspension

a. Attendance Records:

With the exception of a serious illness or accident, if a recipient is absent from his/her required Language sessions for 12 or more hours within a single month, stipends for the following month will be suspended.

b. Academic Performance:

Beginning from the second study term/quarter in Taiwan, if a recipient's academic average for a study term/quarter is less than 80 out of 100, stipends for one month will be suspended in the following term/quarter.

(II) Revocation:

A recipient may be permanently disqualified from receiving a HES scholarship and the remaining stipends will be cancelled, if one of the following situations arises:

a. Failure to submit at the time of matriculation for each study term/quarter, an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) with the reason "Study," on the deadlines as specified by his/her Mandarin training center.

< N.B. This applies to the recipients who carry an award period of six or more months.>

b. Failure to achieve an academic average of 80 or above out of 100 for two single consecutive terms/quarters of study, beginning from the second term/quarter after studying in Taiwan.

c. Absence from exams as a result of missing a score for a study term/quarter, with the exception of a serious illness or accident.

d. Dropping out or being expelled from school.

e. In receipt of another scholarship or subsidy, offered by one of Taiwan's government or educational institutions.

VII. Transfer

After studying for a term/quarter at a Mandarin training center in Taiwan, a recipient with an award period of one year may be allowed to transfer once during the course of his/her study, only if the pertinent educational institutions approve this request. Recipients who carry an award period of less than one year may not apply for a transfer.

VIII. Scholarship Granting

In principle, stipends are granted before the 5th day of each month, through the Mandarin training centers which the recipients attend, and by a method as specified by the individual institutions.

It is mandatory that recipients, who carry an award period of six or more months, participate in the National Health Insurance Plan and purchase the policies of the Student Accident Insurance during the period of their residence and study in Taiwan. The

recipients' educational institutions will deduct fees for these insurance plans from the recipients' stipends, before the processing of the fund granting to them.

< N.B. As a requirement for matriculation at their intended educational institutions, recipients must prepare medical/health insurance policies before their departure to Taiwan, and these documents must be valid a minimum of 4 months, beginning from their arrival date. The policies must bear the authentication of a Taiwan's overseas representative office.>
